

Survey of Likely Special Election Voters in Georgia's 6th Congressional District

Topline Report – March 17, 2017

Clout Research conducted a telephone survey of likely special election voters in Georgia's 6th Congressional District from March 15-16, 2017. The survey included 625 respondents, and carries a confidence interval of 95% with a margin of error of +/- 3.8%.

Question 1. There is a special Congressional Primary election coming up soon in our district – Georgia District 6 - which we will choose a replacement for Republican Tom Price. How likely are you to vote in that upcoming election?
